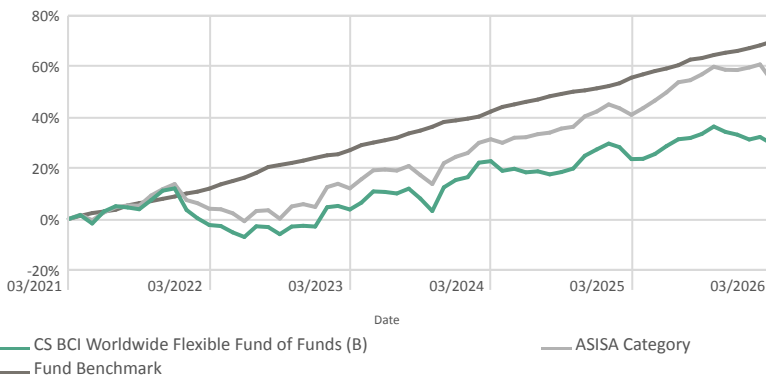
The CS BCI Worldwide Flexible Fund of Funds is a worldwide flexible portfolio with the objective of providing investors with a high long term total return.

**INVESTMENT POLICY**

Investments to be included in the portfolio will, apart from assets in liquid form, consists of participatory interests and other forms of participation of local and global collective investment schemes, or other similar schemes operated in territories with a regulatory environment which is to the satisfaction of the manager and trustee of a sufficient standard to provide investor protection at least equivalent to that in South Africa and which is consistent with the portfolio's primary objective, investing in equity securities, property securities, non-equity securities, money market instruments, preference shares, bonds and other interest bearing instruments and securities.

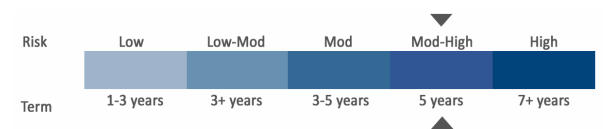
