The Sesfikile BCI Global Property Fund is a global property portfolio with a focus on predominantly developed property markets with an objective to provide the investor with income as well as capital growth.

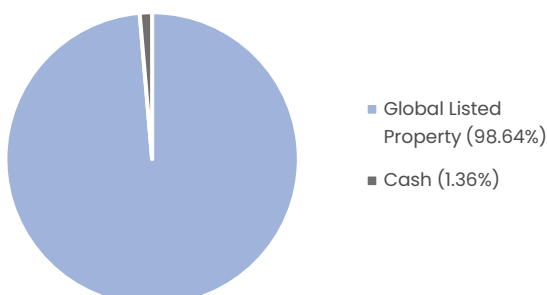

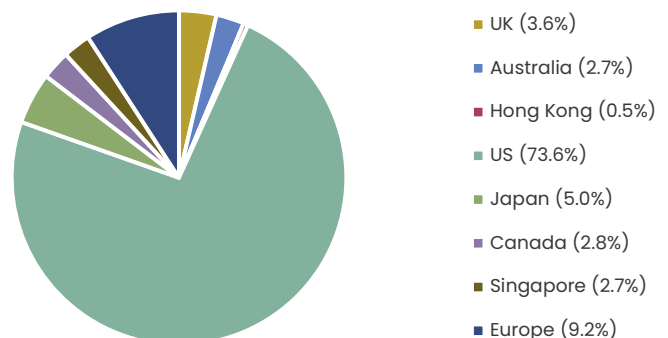

FUND STRATEGY

The Fund's objective is to deliver USD total returns that outperform the FTSE EPRA/NAREIT Developed Rental Net Index ("Index") over a 3 to 5-year investment horizon. Our macro-economic views inform our regional allocations while our sector themes inform our stock picking to deliver outperformance without exposing clients to unnecessary risk.

INVESTMENT POLICY

The policy is to invest in globally listed Real Estate Investment Trusts ("REITs") or listed property companies. The investment manager will also be allowed to invest in financial instruments and cash as allowed by the act from time to time in order to achieve its investment objective. Furthermore, and as legislation permits, the manager shall be permitted to invest in offshore listed property investments on behalf of the Sesfikile BCI Global Property Fund. The portfolio may from time to time invest in listed and unlisted financial instruments. The portfolio's global property exposure will always exceed 80% of the portfolio's asset value. Up to 10% of the portfolio may be invested in shares outside the property sector in companies that conduct similar business activities.

MARKET REVIEW

Global REITs (as measured by the EPRA/NAREIT Developed Rental Index Net TR, USD; "Benchmark") ended the month down 7.2% in USD (-2.7% in ZAR), underperforming global equities and global bonds, which posted a total return of -2.6% and -2.3%, respectively. This took total returns for 2024 to a disappointing 1.3% in USD (4.8% in ZAR). The market declined sharply by 9.4% in Q4 as markets priced in inflationary policies after President Trump convincingly won the election. Investors have raised expectations of tax cuts, fiscal expansion, and nationalist trade policies from the current administration. The drawdown was primarily due to weak performance in December (-7.2%) as the U.S. Federal Reserve (Fed) delivered a hawkish rate cut. The Fed's dot plot projected 50bps of cuts in 2025, down from the previously estimated 100bps, leading to the U.S. 10-year bond yield rising 40bps to close the year at 4.6%.

The expectation of higher inflation and, consequently, higher bond yields led to the outperformance of the hotel sector (-2.5%), which has the shortest lease term (24 hours). High interest rates continue to exacerbate affordability issues, benefiting sectors like manufactured homes (-3.7%), considered affordable housing, and the single-family rental sector (-4.2%), as people are forced to rent due to the prohibitive cost of buying homes. Conversely, the "other" sector (-15.9%) was the worst performer, driven by a 15.5% decline in Iron Mountain. Self-storage (-12.6%) was the second-worst performing sector, likely due to the expectation of subdued housing turnover caused by high interest rates.

Q4 saw increased transaction activity in the retail sector via several deals, including Land Securities' acquisition of Liverpool ONE shopping centre for £490m at a 7.5% yield and British Land's acquisition of six retail parks across the UK for £240m at a 7.4% yield. In Europe, mall REIT Unibail Rodamco-Westfield (URW) sold 80% of Trinity Office Tower (Paris) for €360m, 25% of Centrum Centy Most (Prague) for EUR138m, and a 15% stake in flagship mall Westfield Forums des Halles (Paris) for EUR235m. In the U.S., open-air shopping centre REIT Brixmor bought four centres in Connecticut, Florida, North Carolina, and Michigan for \$293m and sold a centre for \$69m. Kimco Realty bought The Markets Town Centre for \$108m. On the corporate action side PRS REIT announced it is in discussions with several interested parties to acquire the company and that it had made available a data room with an update coming in Q1 2025. Shares of Sunstone Hotel Investors surged 11% following reports that Trinity Investments has expressed interest in acquiring the company for \$13/share.

Global REITs currently trade at a 4.2% forward dividend yield and a 9.5% discount to net asset value (NAV), which we believe presents a compelling value opportunity in our view. Growth is accelerating due to improving tenant demand, while new supply is constrained due to a combination of higher funding and construction costs, making fewer developments feasible. We expect Funds from Operations (FFO) or earnings growth of 5-6% for 2025 and 2026. Asset valuations are also projected to rise by 2-5% in aggregate. Considering these factors, we believe total returns of 8-10% in USD are achievable for 2025.
